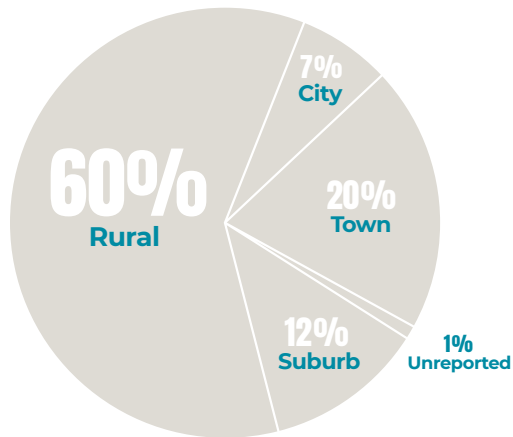

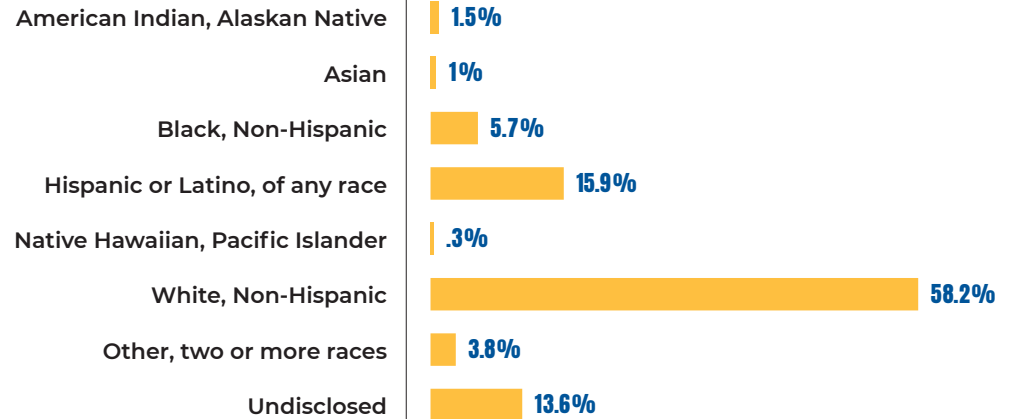

While most FFA chapters are in rural areas, members are represented in all locations.



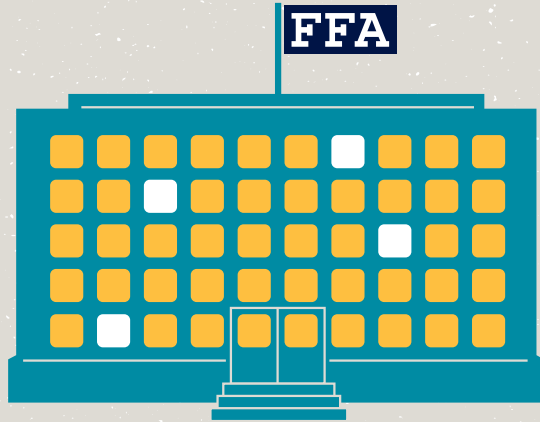
Chapter location, FFA Membership System, 2024.
