# MUSCATINE FFA CHAPTER WINS 2024 STATE FFA MEATS CAREER DEVELOPMENT EVENT

The Muscatine FFA Chapter was named the Champion Team in the annual Iowa FFA Meats Career Development Event held by Iowa State University on August 24, 2024. Members of the first place team included: Cheyenne Mosier, Jack Zorich, Saxby Stein, and Madyson Wyatt. Their agriculture education instructors and FFA advisors are Mr. Sam Paul, Mr. Dave Tometich, Ms. Ashley Wiebe, Mrs. Alexa Coobs, and Ms. Dailyn Garrett. The South O'Brien FFA Chapter was named the Reserve Champion Team. Members of the second place team included: John Puhrmann, Austin Negus, Ethan Schwarz, and William Stout. Their agriculture education instructor and FFA advisor is Mr. Eric Kumm. Jack Zorich, Muscatine FFA Chapter, was named the High Individual Overall in the competition.

The FFA Meats Evaluation Career Development Event provides an opportunity for FFA members to display their agricultural knowledge and skills in the area of Meat Evaluation. Activities included: placing carcass classes of beef, pork, and lamb; placing classes of wholesale and retail meat cuts; quality and yield grading beef carcasses; identifying retail meat cuts, and a problem solving activity. There were 67 members participating from 19 chapters.

The Iowa FFA Meats Evaluation Career Development Event was made possible with support by Iowa Pork Producers Association and Smithfield Foods. The Meats Evaluation and Technology Career Development Event was coordinated and conducted by Terry Houser and the Iowa State University Meats Judging Team along with faculty in the Meat Science Department of the Animal Science Department at Iowa State University.
