# 2025 Iowa FFA Proficiency Award Results

ANKENY, Iowa--FFA members have Supervised Agricultural Experiences (SAEs) as part of school-based agricultural education. These proficiencies range in the areas of Agricultural Communications to Service Learning and from Diversified Agricultural Production to Swine Production. Proficiency Award winners have excelled in their SAE Programs. These awards encourage members to develop specialized skills that will apply toward a future career.

State winners will advance to the National FFA competition where they will compete against winners from the other State FFA Associations. The four national finalists that are selected from each area will be recognized at the National FFA Convention and Expo in October.

The Iowa FFA Proficiency Awards program is possible with support from the many partners of the Iowa FFA Foundation. The specific partner for each area is identified in our summary of results.

<u>FFA Chapter:</u> DeWitt Central FFA Chapter

<u>Description:</u> Kaitlin Truelsen, of the DeWitt Central FFA Chapter, is the winner in the area of Agricultural Communications. Kaitlin has spent a total of 1,196 hours working as the social media content creator for the Referral Center Food Pantry and Thrift Shop and being part of the media and marketing team, CAC Media Group. As the media group's senior leader, Kaitlin conducts interviews, writes a column, and recently published a children's book. Upon her graduation, Kaitlin would like to pursue a career in marketing and communications for the livestock industry. Grace Ahrendsen of the Sioux Central FFA Chapter is the runner-up in this area.

FFA Chapter: Calamus-Wheatland FFA Chapter

<u>Description:</u> Natalie Schroeder, of the Calamus-Wheatland FFA Chapter, is the winner in the area of Agricultural Education, endowed by the Jim Hamilton Memorial. Natalie has created educational videos on a variety of agricultural topics with a series called "Chat with Nat". She is a two-time \$1,000 National SAE grant winner to expand her SAE. She identifies topics, lines up co-stars, writes interview questions, and films, edits, and distributes her videos via a private YouTube Channel. More than 200 elementary students ages 4-12 have viewed her videos. In the future Natalie plans to pursue a career in ag communications or ag education. The runner-up in this area is Kelsey Timp of the South Winneshiek FFA Chapter.

Jacob has utilized his SAE program to enhance his welding skills during employment with Shultes Welding. Using the skills learned in his Ag Ed classes, he has turned those talents into a career in welding. He is attending DMACC to enhance his skills and has proven great proficiency in this area. The runner-up in this area is Kamryn Linder of the Nevada FFA Chapter.

<u>Description:</u> Caleb Zuercher of the MFL MarMac FFA Chapter at Monona is the first-place winner in Ag Mechanics Repair and Maintenance Placement. Zuercher has worked over 200 hours at Palas Service and Repair. He is responsible for the shop area, maintenance, working alongside other mechanics, tearing down and repairing different makes and models of equipment. Caleb plans to attend Northeast Iowa Community College for Diesel Mechanics. The runner-up in this area is Isabella Hayes from the Indianola FFA Chapter.

Jack works at his local locker where he has learned every aspect of the livestock harvesting process from selection of animals and quartering of carcasses to the packaging and grinding of the meat. He helps with ensuring the products are safe and good quality. Jack plans to major in agronomy and continue to work in Northeast Iowa after graduation. The runner-up is Belle Werner of the Benton Community FFA Chapter at Van Horne.

He plans to attend college to pursue an education in agriculture and continue working with the custom bailing operation. <u>Description:</u> Libby Hageman of the Beckman Catholic FFA Chapter at Dyersville is the first-place winner in the area of Agriscience Research - Animal Systems sponsored by CHS Foundation. Libby conducted two research projects related to sanitation and hygiene practices when feeding dairy calves and housing lactating cows. She performed each step of the scientific method and presented results to others at state and national competitions. Upon graduation, Libby plans to pursue a career in dairy science.

<u>Description:</u> Clark Spencer of the Stanton FFA chapter is the first-place winner in the area of Agriscience Research - Integrated Systems. sponsored by the Iowa Biotechnology Association. Clark has completed over 300 hours of research related to food products and processing, plant systems, and ag power. Each year his project increased in scope and complexity. Technical skills and professional skills were learned. Upon graduation, Clark plans to attend Iowa State University and major in Agronomy and Data Science. The runner-up is Valerie Rahe from the Beckman Catholic FFA chapter at Dyersville.

School: Beckman Catholic FFA Chapter, Dyersville

<u>Description:</u> Alexander Kerper from the Beckman Catholic FFA Chapter is the first-place winner in the area of AgriScience research - plant systems sponsored by MinnTex Citrus, Inc. Alexander has completed research projects related to Kernza, a perennial crop related to wheat. Learning outcomes and technical skills related to crop production and the scientific method were obtained. Upon graduation, Alexandra plans to attend college to major in plant science and continue pursuing undergraduate research opportunities.

Proficiency Area: Beef Production - Entrepreneurship

<u>State Winner:</u> Kayden Schnuelle <u>FFA Chapter:</u> Postville FFA Chapter

<u>Description:</u> Kayden Schnuelle of the Postville FFA Chapter placed first in the area of Beef Production Entrepreneurship, sponsored by the Iowa Cattlemen's Foundation. Kayden and his family manage a 100 head beef cow/calf pair operation. Kayden works to feed out all spring-born calves for market, raises fat cattle, and contributes to farm tasks such as hauling manure, bedding cattle and raising his own show cattle. He helps in the management decisions, and breeding strategies aimed at improving genetics for the future and enhancing the overall quality of the herd. Rate of gain, feed efficiencies, and raising high-quality meat is an important focus of Kayden's operation. Upon graduation, Kayden plans to continue on the farm and attend schooling to obtain his CDL. The runner-up is Nathan Beitz from the Maquoketa Valley FFA Chapter at Delhi.

<u>Description:</u> Covey Wynia of the Rock Valley FFA Chapter is the winner in the area of Beef Production Placement, which is sponsored by the Iowa Cattlemen's Foundation. Wynia has worked more than 1,000 hours for a local cow-calf producer. Through his SAE placement experience, Wynia has been directly involved in the raising of cattle; from feeding to animal health. Covey has learned many new skills to support his plans to be actively engaged on the farm in the years ahead following his graduation from high school! Our second-place winner is Brexton Schneider of the ACGC FFA Chapter.

FFA Chapter: Newton FFA Chapter

<u>Description:</u> Grace Guy of the Newton FFA chapter is the first-place winner in the area of Dairy Production Entrepreneurship sponsored by the Iowa State University Dairy Science Club. Guy has increased her dairy herd to include 16 dairy cows and replacement heifers over the past three years. Working with her family farm, she has developed her herd and shown it extensively. She has learned many valuable skills in managing her herd including disease prevention. After graduation, Guy plans to become a bovine embryologist. Our runner-up is Ford Domeyer of the Maquoketa Valley FFA Chapter at Delhi.

FFA Chapter: Maquoketa Valley FFA Chapter, Delhi

<u>Description:</u> In the area of Dairy Production Placement, sponsored by the Iowa State University Dairy Science Club, first place goes to Kesley Hoeger from the Maquoketa Valley FFA Chapter at Delhi. She has invested over 1900 hours in unpaid placement on her family's dairy farm. She manages the operation's calves and helps with both morning and night chores, all while managing a busy school workload. She has also learned tremendous calving skills and assistance by overseeing the farm's maternity pen. After graduation, she plans on studying Agricultural Communications. The second-place winner is Landon Guese from the Postville FFA Chapter.

**Proficiency Area:** Diversified Agricultural Production

State Winner: Ben Buhr

FFA Chapter: Vinton-Shellsburg FFA Chapter

<u>Description:</u> Ben Buhr of the Vinton-Shellsburg FFA Chapter is the first-place winner in the area of Diversified Agricultural Production, endowed by Hertz Farm Management. Buhr partners with his grandpa to raise 80 acres of corn and soybeans and also finishes 200 pigs. He buys bulk ingredients to make his own feed rations and has also expanded his grain skills. Each year he has roughly doubled his herd size while also adding 20 acres from his initial farm size. Upon graduation, Buhr plans to attend Iowa State University to major in Agriculture Business and pursue pork and grain production. The runner-up is Anthony Sprank of the Bellevue FFA Chapter.

<u>State Winner:</u> Jaivyn Van Grootheest <u>FFA Chapter:</u> Rock Valley FFA Chapter

<u>Description:</u> Jaivyn Van Grootheest of the Rock Valley FFA Chapter is this year's winner in the area of Diversified Crop Production - Placement, sponsored by CHS Foundation. Grootheest has worked on the 14,000-acre family farm for the past four years for 1,295 hours. One of his great challenges was learning how to stay calm in stressful situations including during a field fire. He is involved in all aspects of the diversified crop production enterprise. The runner-up in this area is Prestyn Bahr of the Postville FFA Chapter.

FFA Chapter: North Linn FFA Chapter, Troy Mills

<u>Description:</u> Walter Rogan of the North Linn FFA chapter at Troy Mills is the first-place winner of Diversified Horticulture sponsored by the Iowa Division Izaak Walton League. Walter has worked for a local organic farmer as well as for the North Linn High School greenhouse. He has applied his new knowledge and leadership skills through every aspect of his work. His future plans are to pursue a career as a tradesman. The runner-up is Jackson Arndt from the Clear Creek Amana FFA Chapter at Tiffin.

Proficiency Area: Diversified Livestock Production

State Winner: Charlie Lane

<u>FFA Chapter:</u> Easton Valley FFA Chapter, Preston

<u>Description:</u> The winner in Diversified Livestock Production, endowed by Milt Luckstead Sr., is Charlie Lane of the Easton Valley FFA Chapter. Charlie has beef cattle, swine, and goats. He purchased his herd from a retiring neighbor while running and feeding them with a larger group owned by his parents. He was also active in the local cattlemen's association. He took a group of 30 Berkshire pigs out of a larger group that were not growing as quickly but through effective management, they became indistinguishable from the large group. Charlie plans to major in Animal Science and promote agriculture on a larger scale. The runner-up in this area is Teagan Liebe of the North Linn FFA Chapter.

FFA Chapter: Maquoketa Valley FFA Chapter, Delhi

<u>Description:</u> Lacy Reth of the Maquoketa Valley FFA Chapter at Delhi is the first-place winner in the area of equine science entrepreneurship, sponsored by the Iowa State University - Block and Bridle Club. Lacy breeds and trains her own horses, while also taking on Training Client Horses. Lacy trained six horses in 2024. After graduation, Lacy plans to continue expanding Reth Horses and pursue horse training and breeding full-time. The second-place winner is Shelby Sorenson from the Central Plains FFA Chapter.

<u>Description:</u> Lola Chedester, of the East Sac FFA Chapter at Lake View, is the first-place winner in the area of Equine Science Placement sponsored by the Iowa Horse Council. Chedester has spent more than 500 hours feeding, training, and grooming horses. After graduation, Chedester plans to pursue education and a career as a large animal vet. Lillie has invested over 100 hours working at Clover Hill Orchard, an apple orchard established by her family in Mount Ayr. Lillie is involved in various aspects of maintaining the orchard including planting trees, mowing the orchard, pruning, harvesting, and assisting in the preparation for events such as the Madison County Covered Bridge Festival. Upon graduation, Lillie hopes to pursue a career in agricultural business management with a focus on specialty crop production and marketing.

During her time there, she has worked with the USDA located in Ames to test the milk. She has learned how to manage a large herd. After high school, she plans to pursue a career as a labor and delivery nurse. The runner-up in this area is Will Feldpausch from the BCLUW FFA Chapter.

<u>Description:</u> Lily Moeller, of the Holland FFA Chapter at Orange City, is the first-place winner in the area of Landscape Installation. Moeller has invested over 500 hours in learning from industry experts and applying her knowledge while working for the City of Orange City. Moeller has learned how to better work with plants and will apply her knowledge in future nursery landscaping contests. The runner-up in this area is Darcy Wiegand from the Davis County FFA Chapter.

Following graduation, Beran plans to major in Ag Business to eventually become a Grain Buyer. Second place in this area is Kylie Munson from the North Linn FFA Chapter at Troy Mills.

Description: Sponsored by Rose Acre Farms, Cael Daufeldt of the West Liberty FFA Chapter

is the first-place winner in the area of Poultry Production. Cael has invested 957 hours at his placements at BKBE Farms as a Farm Production Assistant. Cael's duties have grown over his five years at BKBE. He is responsible for feeding and management, managing farm biosecurity, administering vaccines, facility sanitation, and business record keeping with the 62,500 annual bird operation. He has lowered the farm mortality rate by 5% below the industry standard within his time at BKBE. Cael's future plans are to obtain a degree in Ag Business with a focus on finance to become an Ag Loan Officer. The runner up in this area is Madelyn Thede from the Wilton FFA Chapter.

<u>Description:</u> In the area of Service Learning, sponsored by Iowa Cooperative Foundation, the winner is Alannah McKibben of the Marengo FFA Chapter. McKibben invested over 70 hours coordinating the Care Bag Project. The project focused on providing essential items to children entering the foster care system as well as to individuals in homeless and women's shelters. Upon graduation, McKibben plans to pursue a degree in Nursing. Isabel Birker of the Vinton-Shellsburg FFA Chapter is the runner-up in this area.

<u>Description:</u> Sponsored by the Iowa Club Lamb Association, Alexis Kolbet, of the Osage FFA Chapter, is the first-place winner in the area of Sheep Production. Kolbert began her SAE in 2023 by purchasing 10 ewes. Over the past few years, she had used laparoscopic A.I. to improve her conception rate within her flock. Kolbert shows her lambs at local, state, and national levels which has helped her gain a large networking pool to sell. After graduation, Kolbert plans to pursue a degree in Veterinary Medicine. The runner up in this area is Carson Noonan, from the Cascade FFA Chapter.

Her duties require her to attend to the daily needs of the animals, perform coat and hygiene maintenance, as well as train and supervise a team of employees. She plans to continue in this position and upon graduation pursue a career as a small animal veterinarian. The runner-up in this area is Shayla Helgeson from the Marengo FFA Chapter.

<u>Description:</u> Sponsored by Iowa Pork Producers Association, Hannah Grantz of the DeWitt Central FFA Chapter is the first-place winner in the area of Swine Production Entrepreneurship. She started Grantz Pork with family and marketed swine for local companies. She began with two head of sows and has expanded to nine sows this last year. Her marketing strategy is to sell whole and half pigs that are processed at the local locker. Her future plans are to attend Iowa State University and major in Ag Studies with an emphasis in swine production, nutrition, and marketing. The second-place winner in this area is Isabell Olsasky from the Southeast Warren FFA Chapter at Liberty Center.

With 1,900 hours working in swine barns as a herdsman, she has learned to detect heat, use AI to breed, participate in nutrition and marketing decisions. Upon graduation, Witte plans on attending Iowa State University for animal nutrition. Your runner-up in this area is Delaney Engler, from the Calamus-Wheatland FFA Chapter.

<u>Description:</u> From the West Liberty FFA Chapter, Cole Daufeldt is the winner in the area of Turfgrass Management, sponsored by Iowa Turfgrass Institute. Cole's SAE focuses on his employment at the West Liberty Country Club. He started working there in 8th grade and has grown not only his skill set but his responsibilities as well. Cole having worked over 1,900 hours through the course of his employment has played a major role in purchases by the country club in order to better maintain the grounds, helping the country club invest in about \$100,000 worth of maintenance equipment.
